


Skagit Valley College Board of Trustees Progress Report Core Theme - Access

Historically, as the unemployment rate in Skagit County dips, so does SVC enrollment. Efforts in 2014-15 and 2015-16 resulted in increased enrollment despite declining unemployment.

Core Theme - Access

Objective 1:

The College will meet or exceed Strategic Enrollment Management Targets (SEM).


Indicators:

- 1. Actual State FTEs compared to State FTEs Allocation.
- 2. International FTEs compared to actual.

Threshold:

Meet or exceed State FTE Allocation and International SEM targets.


State Allocation and Actual FTEs



SVC enrolled 96% of the 2016-17 state-funded enrollment target.



Strategic Enrollments - International



SVC enrolled 94% of the International FTE target.

Core Theme - Access

Objective 2:

The College will meet or exceed the statewide participation rate.


Indicator:

SVC District participation rate compared to the CTC System participation rate.

Threshold:

Meet or exceed participation rate for the CTC System.





Participation Rate: The number of persons age 18-44 years enrolled as a percent of the relevant population.



SVC consistently has a 1 point higher participation rate than the CTC system.

Core Theme - Access

Objective 3:

The College enrollment will reflect District demographics.


Indicators:

- 1. Enrollment distribution by race/ethnicity compared to district population
- 2. Enrollment in degree program by race/ethnicity compared to district population
- 3. Enrollment in BEdA program compared to adults with less than a high school diploma in the district.
- 4. Enrollment in ELA program compared to foreign-born residents who don't have English proficiency in the district.

Threshold:

Parity between population and enrollment for student subpopulations.


Latino Students Compared to District Population



SVC enrolled 12 percentage points more Latino students than the community's percentage of Latino residents.



These adults are ages 18 to 64, excluding Running Start students.




SVC continues a high enrollment of Latino students by maintaining the increase of 2 percentage points more than the 2014-15.


Degree-Seeking Latino Students Compared to District Population



SVC enrolled 7 percentage points more degree-seeking Latino students than the community's percentage of Latino residents.



3-Year Trend of Degree-Seeking Latino Enrollments




SVC enrolled 2 percentage points more of degree-seeking Latino students over the last year.


BEdA Students Compared to Adults with No HS Diploma/GED in District



SVC enrolled 2 percentage points fewer BEdA students than the community's percentage of adults ages 18-44 with no high school diploma or GED.




3-Year Trend of BEdA Enrollments



SVC enrolled a 1 percentage point more CCB students in 2016-17 than the previous year, continuing a steady increase in enrollment.






SVC enrolled 2 percentage points more ELA students than the community's percentage of foreign born adults with limited English proficiency.

SVC enrolled a nearly consistent percentage of ELA students over the past three years.

In Summary

SVC state-supported enrollment is reflective of decreased unemployment rates and state-wide enrollment trends.

SVC is increasing our services to the Latino population, and enrollments of Latino students continues to increase.

The number of degree-seeking Latino students is steadily increasing.
