NOTE!: When a Running Start student takes a class at SVC to meet an OHHS graduation requirement, quite often the student will earn more credit than needed. The extra credit amount earned is usually applied to elective credit. Example: Social Science 100 = .50 credit for Modern Global Economics and .50 elective credit.

Advisory: Students enrolled in Running Start classes are required to either attend a High School Advisory class or complete the requirements with a OHHS Running Start Advisory teacher.
