

Historically, as the unemployment rate in Skagit County increases SVC enrollment increases. COVID has affected this historical trend for the last 18 months.


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- Objective 1A

SVC enrolled 73% of the 2020-21 state-funded allocation target.



Participation Rate



Participation Rate: The number of persons aged 18-44 years enrolled as a percent of the relevant population.

SVC's participation rate is consistently 1 percentage point higher than the CTC system.

The College minimizes barriers and maximizes opportunities for diverse student populations


Indicators

Latinx Students Compared to District




SVC enrolled 6 percentage points more Latinx students than the community's percentage of Latinx residents.

4 Year Trend of Latinx Enrollments




SVC continues a high enrollment of Latinx students.

4-Year Trend of Degree-Seeking Latinx Enrollments




SVC continues to increase degree-seeking Latinx enrollments. Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) Threshold-25%


CCB Students Compared to Adults with No HS Diploma/GED in District



SVC enrolled 4% higher CCB students compared to community's percentage of adults ages 18-44 with no high school diploma or GED.




4-Year Trend of CCB Enrollments Compared to District



Covid -19 Stalled Increases in CCB Enrollments


ELA Students Compared to District Adults With Limited English Proficiency

In Summary



- Covid-19 has had a significant negative effect on enrollment, both at the national, state, and local level
- SVC continues to serve a higher percentage of Latinx than the district population
- Enrollments in CCB and ELA continue to be higher than the district population
